

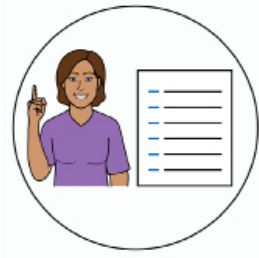

A victim is the person who is abused.



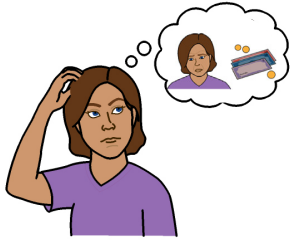
Some people are more likely to be a victim.

Signs are clues that could mean you are a victim of financial abuse.



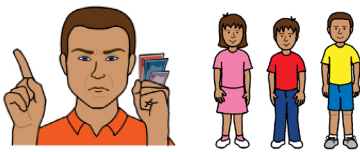
We can help you look for signs of financial abuse and show you where to get help.

Signs of financial abuse from your partner



Your partner might

- stop you from going to work



- **not** pay child support



- tell you how to spend your money



- want to see the receipts after you go shopping.

Other signs of financial abuse

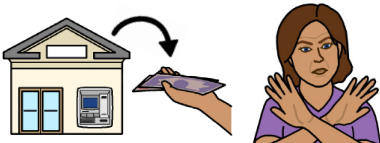


Financial abuse can also mean someone

- tells you **not** to make or spend your money



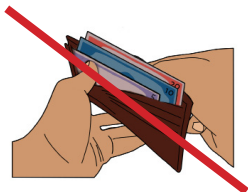
- makes you ask for your own money or only gives money if you do a favour



- makes you take out a loan or cash even when you say **no**



- keeps their money secret from you



- makes you work for your family business and **not** get paid properly.

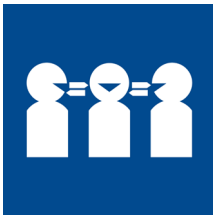
